- 1 Full blown Rose, stamens must be visible
- 1 Decorative Rose, a large hybrid tea, or floribunda type rose, not necessarily exhibition rose, side buds are allowed eg . Just Joey.
- An exhibition rose must have a pointed bud.

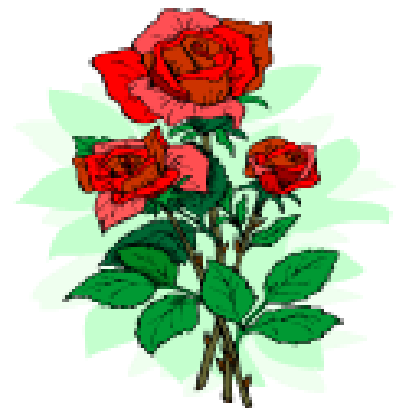

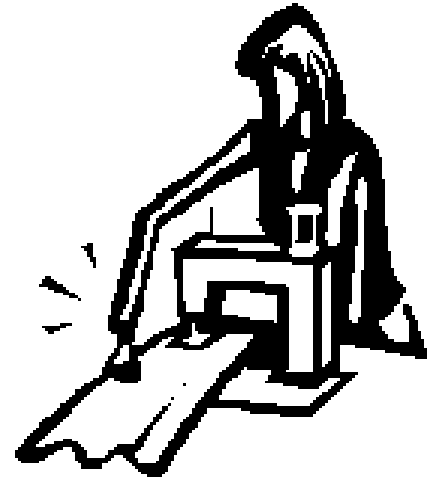

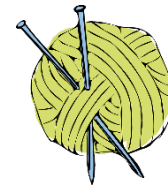
